

Polysomnographic Technician 2

An interesting full-time vacancy has arisen at the Woolcock Institute of Medical Research (WIMR) for a Polysomnographic Technician 2. This is primarily a night time position with occasional day work required.

The WIMR is a world-renowned medical research institute focusing on the causes, prevention, diagnosis and treatment of respiratory disease and sleep disorders.

The position is within our Diagnostic Services Department and will be located at our new purpose-built research centre in Glebe, to which we are re-locating during May. The Diagnostic Services will include a state-of-the-art 8-bed polysomnographic unit, as well as a 6-bed long-term intensive monitoring facility.

Primary accountabilities:

- Collecting, analysing and integrating patient information and data for diagnostic and research studies,
- Performing Polysomnography diagnostic and therapy titration and related diagnostic services as required,
- Assisting with new Technician staff training and re-training to maintain a high level of technical competence within the team,
- Scoring sleep/wake stages and other physiologically significant data according to accepted guidelines or research standards,
- Promoting the image of the Woolcock and marketing its services.

The position requires a self-motivated and organised individual with at least one year's clinical / sleep research and/or electrophysiology diagnostics .

Technical proficiency in patient management and in the performance of diagnostic polysomnography is also required.

Proficiency with MS Office, statistical software and database tools is also required.

A degree, diploma or certificate in a health related area will be highly regarded.
