Applications are invited for a one year fellowship to commence in 2008. This position will be suitable for senior advanced trainees or recently FRACP qualified physicians who wish to pursue a clinical research year or are considering a higher degree in sleep or respiratory research. The successful candidate will be able to choose an appropriate project for the fellowship with one of the CCRE investigators (listed below). Applicants must be an Australian citizen, a New Zealand citizen or an Australian resident.

The fellowship may also provide training in clinical medicine (including contribution to advanced training or to level 1 or 2 sleep training). One year programmes may be incorporated into the MPhil (clinical research) programme or equivalent course through enrolment at the University of Sydney or the University of Newcastle.
