Applications are invited for part-time and full-time post doctoral fellowships in sleep or respiratory research commencing 2008.

The position will be suitable for outstanding researchers within 1-6 years of the award of their PhD, applicants who submit their PhD before March 30 2008 will also be considered. Successful candidates will be able to choose an appropriate project for the fellowship with one of the CCRE investigators (listed below). Salary will be dependant on experience and track record. The duration of the post doctoral fellowship is one year in the first instance with the possibility of one year extension. Part-time and full-time positions are available. Applications from non Australian residents eligible and intending to apply for permanent residency will be considered.
